Foot and Mouth

Is your child sick?

Did you know that there is a 'too sick for school' page on the department's website. This page lists all the common illnesses, what you should look for and what to do if your child has those symptoms.

The information has been provided as a guide by the Department of Health. For example, there has been a few cases of foot and mouth around lately. This is what the fact sheet says about that...

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease

(HFMD)

Symptoms

Generally a mild illness caused by a virus, perhaps with a fever, blisters around the mouth, on the hands and feet, and perhaps the nappy area in babies.

School or home?

Keep home from school until all blisters have dried.

How can I help prevent spread?

Careful hand washing, especially after wiping the nose and using the toilet, and respiratory etiquette (covering a cough or sneeze and disposing of tissues in a rubbish bin).

Remember, you can let the school know your child is not going to be at school by sending in a note, calling the school or sending the teacher a text message. All absences should be explained to the school within 7 days.
