She discussed literacy and numeracy programs in place at the school, student progress and using software to track student progress using the Learning Progressions. This was a valuable opportunity to speak face-to-face online to gain valuable feedback to ensure our students learning is maximized at the school. I look forward to continuing to utilise technology to connect with professional learning opportunities to support our students.

Pie Warmer

Last week students discussed healthy options for pie warmer lunches. We discussed several foods that students like to eat, cook and prepare. We will look at how these foods are prepared and could be heated in the oven as a pie warmer lunch. We also discussed the benefits of eating a variety of foods. This discussion included everyday foods and sometimes foods.

Please make sure that pie warmer lunches are in a suitable wrap, such as aluminum foil, or container, such as a disposable foil container. They also need to be clearly labeled with the child's name.





Science

Last week during our science lesson, students explored different forces using toys and games. We looked at push, pull, gravity and stored energy in a pull back toy car. Students also used books to identify aspects of the topic they would like to further their learning in. Areas students identified that they would like to learn more about included; electricity, wind power, what is electricity and solar power. We will continue learning about forces and energy throughout the term.










Mothers Day Gifts

Last week students used the art room in K/1/3 for literacy groups. We made the most of this opportunity making Mothers Day cards. This invloved a modelled writing session, writing messages inside our cards. We then painted our hands to create two plants on the front. This was followed by some careful finger painting to create petals for the flowers. We finally pasted on flower pots. The cards were then completed with some writing on the front and personal drawings throughout by the students.

Miss O'Meara worked with the students during Wednesdays art session to make a lovely photo frame gift for students to give to their mums. This activity followed on from maths, with students using 2D shapes to construct their frames. Thank you Miss O'Meara for your effort with printing the photos for this activity.

Students worked with Mrs Follet and myself on Friday to create another special gift that looked at measurement. Students used a jar and dry ingredients to make a "Chocolate Chip Cookies in a jar" gift. This involved careful measuring and reading of these recipe. NAPLAN – THIS WEEK

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2018

Years 3 and 5 students in all government and non-government schools will sit the NAPLAN in 2018. The program assesses literacy and numeracy.

Tests will be sat across Australia on the same dates.

- Tuesday 15th May: Language and Conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and Writing
- Wednesday 16th May: Reading
- Thursday 17th May: Numeracy

Attendance and absences

Information from the NSW Department of Education

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- •being sick or having an infectious disease
- •having an unavoidable medical appointment
- •being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- •exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Celebrate Attendance

Hints and Tips No. 5: Tips for Parents



Going to school is important. It makes learning easier for your child and helps build and maintain friendships with other children.

- Keep your child home only when they are sick.
- Advise the school of any absence.
- See doctors and dentists after school times.

Friends are important.

- Show an interest in your child's friends
- Invite friends to come and play
- Encourage your child to play with other children.

Helping your child have a happy day at school is important for you and your child.

If you are having difficulties in getting your child to school you should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the problem and ask for help.

The principal may ask a Home School Liaison Officer to contact you for further assistance and advice.

Hints and Tips No. 6: School Community



Everyone in the school community has a role to play in helping with school attendance.

Having students attend school is extremely beneficial to the future of local communities. However, many students do not attend school regularly or fail to attend at all.

Schools, parents and caregivers, local community members and businesses are all an essential part of providing and supporting education in our schools.

The NSW Department of Education and Training employs Home School Liaison Officers across the state. These officers are teachers who support schools and the school community to ensure that all students attend school regularly.
